The Peter Moore Memorial Fund and Award

1. This fund and award commemorate the life of **Nolan Peter Moore, FCGI, DIC**, (Mech 1940) and his lifelong contributions to Engineering, and to the College, the City & Guilds College Association and the City & Guilds Motor Club. The fund was inaugurated in 2001 by means of an initial generous donation by a member of the City & Guilds College Association.
2. The Trust Fund Board has determined that the initial contribution and all subsequent donations shall be treated as capital, and invested in accordance with the established procedures used for all other assets of the Trust.
3. At the beginning of each Trust financial year [1st October] the value of the fund is recorded as a percentage of the total Trust funds, and at the close of the financial year a commensurate proportion of the income from the Trust's investments is credited to the Peter Moore Memorial Fund in the ratio that the fund's capital bore to the Trust's total capital assets at the beginning of that financial year.
4. The income is used for two purposes:-
 - 4.1 For the relief of unexpected financial hardship suffered by any student [whether undergraduate or postgraduate] of the Mechanical Engineering Department provided this is incurred after commencing the course and through no fault of the student's own making. Any and all decisions shall be made in consultation with the Senior Tutor and/or Head of Department, and in general accord with the Trust's normal procedures.
 - 4.2 To provide each year a suitably engraved tankard to the person nominated by the City & Guilds College Union [or the Engineering Faculty Student Union] as the official Boanerges Driver. In addition to the usual coat of arms, the tankard shall be engraved with the following:-

'Peter Moore Memorial Award'
(the year of award)
(the name of the recipient)

A record thereof shall be maintained by the College Union and the Trust.
 - 4.3 In accordance with current procedure, the CGCA will invite the Bo Driver to attend the CGCA Annual Dinner as a guest of the Association. The tankard will be presented at the dinner and a brief presentation speech shall be made outlining the background and purpose of the Award.
5. If in any year the income exceeds the total required for any grants and the cost of an engraved tankard, the surplus shall be held by the Trust for the benefit of the City & Guilds Motor Club, and used in the event that funds are required for the repair or refurbishment of Boanerges. Should it be the case that applications for assistance exceed the anticipated income available, further monies may be granted from the general funds of the Trust. As a matter of principle, the capital of the fund will not be utilised under any foreseeable circumstances.
