JESSEL ROSEN AWARD FOR GRADUATE OVERSEAS EXPERIENCE – RULES

1. The Jessel Rosen Award for Graduate Overseas Experience will be made to a graduate or postgraduate student who was formerly an undergraduate student of one of the seven Departments of the Faculty of Engineering formerly comprising the City & Guilds College*, who whilst at College, or within a year of leaving the College, accepts an overseas assignment of not less than three months' duration in an under-developed country.
2. The assignment must not have any direct relationship with their normal terms of employment.
3. The assignment should be in the general field of environmental science, and should have a direct connection with a project involving engineering - preferably, but not necessarily, electrical engineering.
4. Applicants may be of any nationality and of either sex, but must be ordinarily domiciled in the United Kingdom.
5. The project to be undertaken should not be located in any country in which the applicant has previously been domiciled, or in which they have had any prolonged residence. However, this requirement may in certain circumstances be varied at the discretion of the Trust Fund Board.
6. The recipient of the Award will be expected to submit to the Trust Board a report of his or her experience, which may at the discretion of the Board be considered for inclusion in the "Imperial Engineer" Journal of the City & Guilds College Association and the Royal School of Mines Association.
7. The amount of the award is £600 for a three-month project, varying pro-rata up to £1,200 (maximum) for a project of six months' duration. If the award is not made in any particular year, it may be possible either for it to be made either in an increased amount, or to more than one applicant, in a subsequent year.
8. Applications should be made in writing, with supporting documentation, on the standard Old Centralians' Trust Application form, obtainable on request from Dr Teresa Sergot, Level 2, Faculty Building, Imperial College, LONDON, SW7 2AZ (Tel. 41184). Applications should be accompanied by additional budget and programme data wherever possible, and must be supported in writing by the Head of the relevant College Department, and by the Dean of Engineering. In the event of an application's being successful, the award will be confirmed either by the Board of the Old Centralians' Trust, or by a small committee of its members appointed for the purpose.
9. Successful applicants, if not already members of the City & Guilds College Association, will be strongly encouraged to take up membership.

* The seven Departments recognised as such are as follows: Aeronautics, Bioengineering, Chemical Engineering & Chemical Technology, Civil & Environmental Engineering, Computing, Electrical & Electronic Engineering (including ISE) and Mechanical Engineering.
